I was beaten by my husband last year when I went to perform Deuda (a popular group dance in the Western part of Nepal) on Women's Day with other women from the village. I was not a member of CDC at that time. After my participation in CDC, I understood various aspects of women's rights and policies including legal provisions for violence. I discussed these with my husband and other family members and warned them that I would take legal action if they continued any kind of violence on me. My husband now supports me with household chores and participates in social events including Deuda. He even attends CDC discussions whenever he can.
